And during all this time, the Spirit of God has been with you. Your "Dreaming", which influences your lives so strongly that, no matter what happens, you remain forever people of your culture, is your only way of touching the mystery of God's Spirit in you and in creation. You must keep your striving for God and hold on to it in your lives... Do not think that your gifts are worth so little that you should no longer bother to maintain them. Share them with each other and teach them to your children. Your songs, your stories, your paintings, your dances, your languages, must never be lost. Do you perhaps remember those words that Paul VI spoke to the aboriginal people during his visit to them in 1970? On that occasion, he said: "We know that you have a lifestyle proper to your own ethnic genius or culture – a culture which the Church respects and which she does not in any way ask you to renounce...".

"...Some people see the world as a hostile place filled with spirits and forces antagonistic to them. People turn to their ancestors, gods and spirits for protection living in the rocks etc. The focus of the Christian life, in contrast, is the relationship believers have with God. God's relationship with humankind is based on grace and love. His laws are clearly revealed to us in the Holy Scriptures. When we disobey, we may suffer the consequences of our sin or experience His discipline, which is always motivated by His love and intended to bring us to a right relationship with Him. In times of difficulty, we do not fear His wrath but He invites us to draw even closer to Him. 1 Jn 4:16-18 says, "God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God and God in him. In this way, love is made complete among us so that we will have confidence on the day of judgment because in this world we are like Him. There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear . . . " Although believers encounter tragedy and suffering, we do not live in fear but in faith, trusting in the character of God."

Sexual immorality is strongly condemned in the Bible. In the Old Testament, laws were given to the Israelites designed to discourage sexual immorality. These laws prohibited adultery and other forms of sexual misconduct, such as incest and rape. In the New Testament, Jesus taught that all sexual relationships outside of marriage are immoral. He also taught that lusting after someone is just as sinful as the act itself. The Bible makes it clear that God expects us to remain sexually pure and faithful to our spouses. God's plan for marriage is beautiful, and He wants us to honour and protect it. If we do not, we risk damaging our relationships with both God and others. In the New Testament, "sexual immorality" is most frequently translated as *porneia*, which means "a surrendering of sexual purity," and is mostly used regarding premarital sexual relations. From this Greek word, we get the English word pornography, deriving from the idea of "selling off." Sexual immorality is essentially the "selling off" of sexual purity and involves sexual expression beyond the boundaries of a biblically defined marriage relationship (Mt 19:4-5). I don't wonder that the book "Welcome to Sex" vanished from the shelves...
