WYD Lisbon is held from 1st to 6th Aug. this year. "Rise Up" is a new model of WYD catechesis which challenges the youth to reflect about big themes pointed out at Pope Francis pontificate: Integral Ecology, Social Friendship and Mercy. Integral ecology enables people to see themselves in deep relationships with all creation, and to see that all of creation is in a deep relationship with God. Integral ecology is a key concept in chapter four of (Laudato Si), Pope Francis' encyclical on the environment. It flows from his understanding that everything is closely related. Pope Francis gives several indications in <i>Fratelli tutti</i> to help define the term Social Friendship and Mercy. "A love capable of transcending borders is the basis of what in every city and country can be called 'social friendship'. Genuine social friendship within a society makes true universal openness possible," he writes (FT, 99). The pope indicates that it is a quality to be implemented collectively. She was born in Melbourne and is best known for her activities in South Australia. She founded the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart (the Josephites), a congregation of religious sisters that established a number of schools and welfare institutions throughout Australia and New Zealand, with an emphasis on education for the rural poor. She was beatified in January 1995 by Pope John Paul II and canonised on 17 October 2010, during a public ceremony in St Peter's Square at the Vatican by Pope Benedict XVI.
