

Each year on 21st Nov., both Catholic and Orthodox churches celebrate the Presentation of the Virgin Mary in the Temple. While originally this day marked the dedication of a basilica in Jerusalem, it quickly became associated with this extra-biblical event, not found in the New Testament. The feast is based on an ancient text from the year 145, called *The Protoevange-*

lium of James, a text that was revered by early Christians. In it, we find the Virgin Mary's parents entrusting her to the Jewish Temple at an early age. This was a custom of some Jewish parents at the time. Religious parents never fail by devout prayer to consecrate their children to the divine service and love, both before and after their birth. Some amongst the Jews, not content with this general consecration of their children, offered them to God in their infancy, by the hands of the priests in the temple, to be lodged in apartments belonging to the temple, and brought up in attending the priests and Levites in the sacred ministry. While the historicity of the document has been questioned, the event has always been a day for religious men and women to consecrate themselves to God, in imitation of the Virgin Marv.

15 hidden gems in the Synod on Synodality. The report, titled "A synodal church in mission," follows an intense month of debates at the Vatican among some 450 participants over a range of big issues: 1. a new stress on lay involvement; 2. "Conversation in the Spirit." The term refers to a practice that "enables authentic listening in order to discern what the Spirit is saying to the Churches"; 3. the report acknowledges disagreements and uncertainties. 4. the report addresses the concerns of women. 5. it did not forget the poor; 6. it charges the church with combating racism and xenophobia; 7. abuse in the church must be dealt with; 8. the synod participants called for reforming priestly formation. 9. the synod called for a regular review of how bishops, priests and deacons carry out their ministry in their diocese; 10. the report took on liturgical language, saying the texts used in Catholic rites should be "more accessible to the faithful and more embodied in the diversity of cultures." 11. it raised the possibility of offering Communion to non-Catholics, or what it called "Eucharistic hospitality (Communicatio in sacris). 12. the report took aim at what it means to be a deacon in the church. As it is, the deaconate is largely seen as a steppingstone to priesthood; 13. reform of the Roman Curia must continue; 14. the report said canon law needs updating.; 15. the synod wants to promote small Christian communities, "who live the closeness of the day-to-day, around the Word of God and the Eucharist".

Advent always starts four Sundays before Christmas. This year, in 2023, Advent starts on Sunday, 3rd Dec. and ends each year on Christmas Eve, 24th Dec. The coming Liturgical Sunday Masses readings will be taken from Cycle B. Daily Masses will follow readings of Cycle 2.
